

Resolution #2013-09

To Designate City Council Liaison to Housing Commission

**Purpose and Finding:** This resolution designates the individual who is to act as a liaison between the Albion City Council and the Albion Housing Commission. Quality housing is important to the residents of the City of Albion and the Albion Housing Commission was created to ensure residents of the City have safe and affordable housing. It is in the best interests of the citizens of the City of Albion for the City Council to have regular updates regarding activities of the Housing Commission. As such, a liaison between the two public bodies is appropriate. A council person from a precinct with public housing should be the liaison with the Albion Housing Commission and shall be appointed by the Mayor for a two (2) year term.

Council Member Barnes moved, supported by Council Member Brown, to approve the following resolution.

**RESOLVED**, that a Councilperson from Precinct with public housing shall act as liaison between the Albion City Council and the Albion Housing Commission and shall attend open meetings of the Housing Commission and report to the City Council monthly on activities of the Housing Commission;

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this resolution shall also be sent to the Housing Commission to serve as formal, continuing and ongoing notice to the Housing Commission that, pursuant to MCL 125.55 and MCL 15.261 et. seq., the liaison, on behalf of the City of Albion, requests a copy of the full and complete Housing Commission meeting agenda and packet for each and every open meeting conducted subsequent to the adoption of this resolution. Said agenda and packet to be delivered in advance of each meeting to the Albion City Clerk, 112 W. Cass St., Albion, MI 49224.
