The Ashland Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session in the Commissioners' Chambers, City Building, Ashland, Kentucky, on Thursday, March 8, 2018, at the hour of 12:00 PM. **Mayor and City Commissioners' Comments**

Commissioner Gute welcomed the audience and reminded everyone to set their clocks up one hour this weekend. He announced that Easter is April 1 and the Annual Easter Egg hunt will be held in Central Park at the bandstand on March 31 at 11:00 AM.

**Ashland Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO) Long Term Control Plan and Consent Judgment Update by Mark Sneve of Strand and Associates**

Director of Engineering and Utilities Ryan Eastwood introduced Mark Sneve of Strand and Associates regarding completed CSO projects and future CSO projects.

Mr. Sneve reported he has been working on the CSO plan since 2002. The Wastewater Treatment Plant was put into service in 1960. Mr. Sneve reviewed with the Commission combined sewers and the Consent Judgment entered into by the City with the Kentucky Division of Water. The Consent Judgment was a commitment by the City of Ashland to address federal regulations regarding combined sewers. In 2015 the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency closed the Administrative Order previously issued as it recognized that the City is meeting its commitment allowing the City to report directly to the State of Kentucky only. Projects completed are improvements to the Roberts Drive and 6<sup>th</sup> Street Pump Stations; improvements to the 37<sup>th</sup> Street Pump Station; the Greenup Avenue manhole interceptor project; and the 29<sup>th</sup> Street project is nearing completion. The last major project required is the improvement to the Wastewater Treatment Plant which will cost approximately \$28 million. The Commission thanked Mr. Sneve for the update.

**PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

Carol Allen, Director of the Highlands Museum and Discovery Center, appeared before the Commission regarding and update on future activities. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Highlands Hero-Con will be taking place on April 7. The Smithsonian Institute’s traveling exhibit of “Hometown Teams: How Sports Shape America” will be at the Highlands Museum beginning April 14 and continuing through May 18.

Carly Carver, 3901 Blackburn Avenue, appeared before the Commission to announce the Special Needs Easter event on April 1 from 1:00 to 4:00 PM in Central Park sponsored by Buddy’s Sensory Exchange.

David Stapleton, 3016 Railroad Street, appeared before the Commission regarding the following concerns:

Raw sewage leaking from an exposed pipe on Simpson Road which is part of the 29<sup>th</sup> Street project

Mr. Stapleton advised he was cited for a junk vehicle on his property approximately two years ago and that he was told he needed to purchase current tags for the vehicle or have it towed. He questioned why there is a Ford F150 parked on private property located near the Ashland Police Department that hasn’t had current tags for 11 years

Mr. Stapleton advised he requested a copy of a police report and/or citation involving his father and complained that the information redacted was actually still legible

Mr. Stapleton read about the give-away at Christmas conducted by Ashland in Motion to help the 29<sup>th</sup> Street businesses but reported it did not make any sense that the City would want to help the businesses by re-routing traffic away from the businesses. He complained that police officers should be patrolling the neighborhoods where traffic is being re-routed and checking for speeding cars instead of patrolling areas such as Winchester Avenue

Mayor Gilmore thanked Mr. Stapleton for his comments and advised these issues would be reviewed.

Josh Thompson, 1104 Third Circle Project, appeared before the Commission asking about the cost estimate on the upcoming project reported on by Mr. Sneve from Strand and Associates. Mr. Thompson was referred to Director of Engineering and Utilities Ryan Eastwood.

Commissioner Clark advised that some organizations' by-laws would need to be changed due to the fact the Mayor makes appointments to some Boards.

Commissioner Perkins agreed.

Mayor Gilmore did not think he had appointed anyone to a Board who receives funds from the City other than as an ex-officio member.

Commissioner Gute requested additional time to review the change recommended by Commissioner Perkins. Commissioner Clark stated the City needs to look at the organizations and their Board members to be assured the City would not be gutting the governing boards by removing current members and/or volunteers such as the Ashland School Safety Patrol, Summer Motion, Poage Landing Days, etc. Commissioners Perkins and Steen stated that by adding this new guideline, any level of concern regarding a conflict of interest would be removed. It raises the bar for transparency and ethics.
