Roseau County Social Service Center offers a variety of financial assistance and social services including, but not limited to the following areas -

FINANCIAL SERVICES OFFERED BY ROSEAU COUNTY SOCIAL SERVICES: 463-2411

MFIP - Minnesota Family Investment Program.

Provides a monthly cash payment and food support for the basic needs of children and their parent(s) or qualified relatives. Parents are expected to work and must comply with Employment Service requirements. MFIP is limited to 60 months in a lifetime.

GA - General Assistance. Provides financial aid to persons without children who meet a basis of eligibility and who lack the income needed to secure food, shelter and other basic necessities.

MA - Medical Assistance. Established to help people pay for their medical care. If eligibility requirements are met, part or all of your medical bills will be paid by this program.

SNAP PROGRAM - Increases the food purchasing power of low income, qualified households in the form of monthly benefits that can only be used for food.

CHILD SUPPORT AND COLLECTION - Designed to assist in collection of child support for minor children and also establishes paternity for children born out of wedlock. This service is also available to non-public assistance clients.

Energy Assistance: Grants to pay heating expenses; assistance dealing with a crisis affecting the ability to maintain heat in the home, such as a receipt of a disconnection notice or a vendor notice of refusal to deliver fuel; energy related repairs for homeowners that have a breakdown of the heating system of the home or a potentially hazardous condition of the home. Assistance can be used for furnace repair or replacement, roof repairs, chimney repairs or replacement.

Weatherization Program: Assists low income households by reducing the energy consumption needed to heat a home and retain a comfort level. Weatherization measures include insulation, caulking, weather-stripping, and repair or replacement of windows. Elderly, handicapped and high energy consumption households are given priority.

Housing Loans and Grants: Provides deferred loans and low interest loans to eligible property owners for rehabilitation of homes.

Emergency Resources: Limited funds are available for emergency food and shelter.

Tax Aid: Assists renters and homeowners to apply for a tax or rent credit.

Outreach Program: Identifies and reaches eligible households. The outreach program provides information and directions on services available.

Head Start: A comprehensive child development program designed to meet the needs of preschool children and their families. Little Brother/Little Sister Program: Helps youth between the ages of 4 and 13. It is based on the concept that young people can benefit from the influence of a consistent positive role model. The Roseau County Sheriff's Department has a TDD available to communicate with any other TDD on a 24-hour basis at 911 or (218) 463-1421. Individuals calling the sheriff's department dispatcher are to, at intervals, strike the space bar, alerting the dispatcher that this a TDD call. Upon recognizing a TDD call, the dispatcher will communicate through a TDD to assist the caller. (*Also known as Text Telephone.)
