RE: Waupaca County Reopening and Mass Gatherings

On May, 13, 2020 the Wisconsin Supreme Court ruled that the Wisconsin Emergency Order #28 (Safer at Home) is subject to administrative rule making and all provisions outlined under Emergency Order #28 were lifted effective immediately. In response to the current conditions of the COVID-19 pandemic, Waupaca County Public Health is issuing the following order Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 252.03(1)&(2):

1. Businesses:

All Waupaca County businesses are allowed to open and shall follow the reopening guidelines developed by the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC). The WEDC reopening guidelines can be found at: <https://wedc.org/reopen-guidelines/>

Businesses are also advised to follow any guidelines issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Current guidelines can be found at: <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/community/organizations/businesses-employers.html>

2. Religious, Non-profit, and other Organizations:

All religious, non-profit, and other organizations shall comply with WEDC's "General Guidelines" for reopening and follow related CDC guidelines: <https://wedc.org/reopen-guidelines/> and <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/community/organizations/index.html>

3. Mass Gatherings:

Mass gatherings shall be limited to **50** individuals. "Mass gathering" means any planned or spontaneous, public or private event or convening confined to a close space, whether inside or outside, at the same time.
